I've got buckets but if you've got little dixie cups (bathroom size) so the kids can drink it without getting piggy about it that would be awesome. Since these are the unfriendly cast members I'd like it if you had band-aids available for the little ones that complain about the love-chomps. That's what I call them and it usually makes the kids laugh and forget about the bruising!
